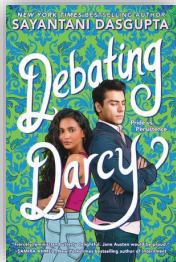

Debating Darcy by Sayantani DasGupta

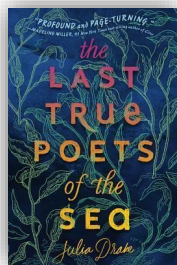

The Last True Poets of the Sea by Julia Drake

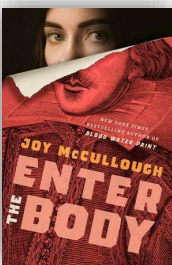

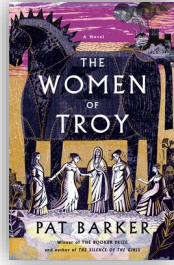

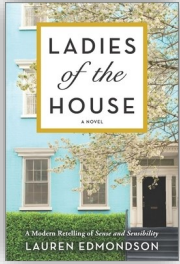


Clytemnestra by Constanza Casati

James by Percival Everett

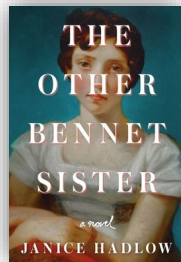
A retelling of *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, both harrowing and ferociously funny, told from the enslaved Jim's point of view.

Pride and Prejudice with a modern twist—a feel-good, laugh-out-loud comedy of love where you least expect it.

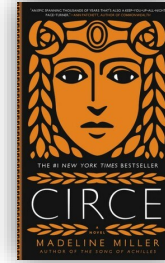


Demon Copperhead by Barbara Kingsolver

Hello Beautiful by Ann Napolitano

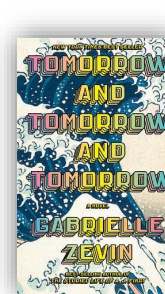
