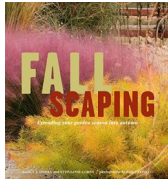

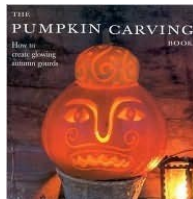
**Fallscaping: Extending Your Garden Season into Autumn** by Nancy J. Ondra & Stephanie Cohen (635.953 OND)

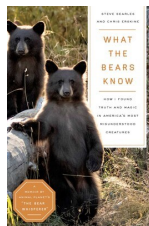

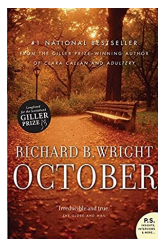

# Autumn Reads



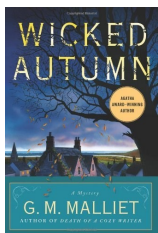
## Fiction

**October by Richard B. Wright (FIC WRIGHT R)** In England to see his ill daughter, a retired literature professor meets by chance a man he once knew as a boy and is asked to accompany him on a final, unthinkable journey.



**Autumn Leaves, 1922 by Tessa Lunney (FIC LUNNEY T)** October 1922. Kiki Button has had a rough year at home in Australia after her mother's sudden death. As the leaves turn gold on the Parisian boulevards, Kiki returns to Europe, more desperately in need of Paris and all its liveliness than ever.

**Wicked Autumn by G. M. Malliet (FIC MALLIE G)** With his tranquility as the established vicar of a New Age village shattered by the murder of an unpopular woman, a former MI5 agent struggles with past demons while trying to identify a killer in his peaceful community.



**Autumn by Ali Smith (FIC SMITH A)** Two old friends—Daniel, a centenarian, and Elisabeth, born in 1984—look to both the future and the past as the United Kingdom stands divided by a historic, once-in-a-generation summer.

**Pumpkin Spice Peril by Jenn McKinlay (PB MCKINL)** When a woman is poisoned after eating pumpkin spice cupcakes, a bakery is eyed with suspicion.



**An Event in Autumn by Henning Mankell (FIC MANKEL H)** Eager for a life change, Inspector Wallander moves to an old farmhouse—where he finds a skeletal hand in a shallow grave.

**First Frost by Sarah Addison Allen (FIC ALLENS)** Two magical sisters. One cranky apple tree. It's October in Bascom, North Carolina. As temperatures drop and leaves begin to turn, the Waverley women are made restless by the whims of their mischievous apple tree and the magic that swirls around it.



**Death by Jack-o'-Lantern by Alexis Morgan (PB MORGAN)** A man accused of trespassing and stealing pumpkins is found with a knife in his back in a corn maze.

**Turkey Trot Murder by Leslie Meier (FIC MEIER)** A young woman is found dead in a pond, casting a shadow on a small Maine town's annual Turkey Trot 5K run.

**Overkilt by Kaitlyn Dunnett (FIC DUNNET K)** Liss's meddlesome mother is back home to serve a hefty portion of trouble in time for Thanksgiving. But when a scandalous murder case threatens to leave Liss alone at the table, family drama takes on a terrifying new meaning.



**Fogged Inn by Barbara Ross (PB ROSS)** An autumn chill has settled over Busman's Harbor, Maine, but Julia Snowden is warming up the town by offering lobster stew at the local diner. When her landlord discovers a dead body in the walk-in refrigerator, Julia must figure out who ordered up a side of murder.

**A Simple Autumn by Rosalind Lauer (FIC LAUER)** As swirling leaves of orange and gold dance across the countryside, two Amish brothers must find the courage and faith to reconcile their heritage and their hearts.

**Wrong Place Wrong Time (MCGALLI G)** It's late. You're waiting up for your son. Then you spot him: he's with someone. And - you can't believe what you see - your funny, happy teenage boy stabs this stranger. That night you fall asleep in despair. But when you wake . . . it is yesterday. The day before the murder. Somewhere in the past lie the answers - a reason for this crime.

**Autumn Skies by Denise Hunter (FIC HUNTER D)** Grace has a lot on her plate: running the Bluebell Inn by herself now that her siblings and co-owners have moved on, getting her new store Blue Ridge Outfitters off the ground, and coping with a childhood event she'd thought was long past.



**Picture Perfect Autumn by Shelley Noble (FIC NOBLES S)** A Manhattan photographer finds inspiration and new possibilities in a Gothic Rhode Island beach house. On a shoot at an antiques barn, she discovers an envelope of old photos and sees in them what her photos are missing. Her search for their source leads Dani to a small Rhode Island town, a dilapidated American Gothic beach house and Lawrence Sinclair.

**A Sound of Falling Leaves by Lisa Carter (FIC CARTER L)** Amid the autumn splendor of an isolated Appalachian community, a opera singer who lost her voice uncovers an unnerving connection between a murder case and a long-ago disappearance.

**October Song by Beverly Lewis (FIC LEWIS B)** As Katie and Daniel adjust to marriage, Katie reaches out to her family for acceptance, Rachel's husband Philip tries to fit in with his new Amish peers, and Levi continues his courtship of Lydia.
