Robotics with Arts and Crafts - This arts and crafts program combines creativity with engineering as participants explore basic robotics through hands-on projects. It is led by FIRST Tech Challenge Team 25650, an all-girls robotics team. Girls are especially encouraged to participate! Ages 10-14

Steelpan Workshop - Music for Everyone - Steelpan performance, history lesson and hands on workshop experience. Age 6 - 16.

Teen Summer Zine - Teens will learn from local arts professionals while creating their own hand-made publications that can include comics, fan art and fan fiction, poetry, collage, and illustrations. All art and writing materials will be provided, along with snacks! Ages 12-19.

Ukulele Uprising - This children's concert is open to families. All ages.
